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




#### **COVID-19 Cases and Vaccination Rates**

Lincoln	10	7.7	7,145	85




#### **COVID-19 Prevention**



- Last month a federal judge lifted the federal mask mandate for transportation settings, but each airline and local transit system can set their own rules.
- Last week the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) restated their recommendation that individuals older than 2 years old continue to wear masks in airports, planes, trains and public transportation systems. This recommendation is based on current data, circulating variants and their impact on disease severity and vaccine effectiveness.

# **COVID-19 Vaccine Update**

- On April 28<sup>th</sup>, Moderna submitted a request to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for emergency use authorization for its COVID-19 vaccine for children ages 6 months through 5 years old.
- Vaccine would be a two-dose series, about one month apart





#### **Electronic Vaccine Card**

- Oregon's My Electronic Vaccine Card gives you an electronic copy of COVID-19 vaccinations you've received in Oregon.
  - It is the same information on your paper vaccine card.

#### Getting started:

Go to <a href="https://myelectronicvaccinecard.oregon.gov">https://myelectronicvaccinecard.oregon.gov</a> (available in 13 languages) and fill out required information. Once you submit the information you will receive a link to your vaccination record within a few minutes, on your cell phone or email.

# **Long COVID-19 Protection**

# **General State Updates**



# New and repeated items

- Cost of Living Support Payments: HB 4157 (2022) provides a one-time \$600 payment to low-income workers.
- Renter Rights and Access to Cooling: <u>SB 1536</u> In response to the summer 2021 heatwave, that caused deaths across the state. Effective immediately this bill allows residential tenants to install and use portable cooling devices; imposes regulations on landlords during heatwaves; and much <u>more</u>.
- ➤ 1115 Waiver: 2022-27 Renewal Application continues foundational elements of OHP with focus on addressing health inequities, maintaining commitment to achieving universal coverage, and promoting high-quality care and cost containment. First round of negotiations with CMS will conclude on May 12.



# **Healthier Oregon**

- > What: Formerly "Cover all People" and now called "Healthier Oregon"
- ➤ When: As of July 1, 2022, more adults will be eligible for OHP regardless of immigration status
- Who is Eligible: People living in Oregon who:
  - Meet income and other criteria
  - Currently don't qualify for full OHP benefits because of immigration status
  - Are 19-25 years old or 55 years and older, including pregnant members
    - People in these age group who can currently get CWM benefits (emergency Medicaid) will be eligible for full OHP

# 988 Call Center and Crisis Response System

- ➤ What: In 2021, HB 2417 passed, which creates a 988-call center and crisis response system. This sets up Mobile Response and Stabilization Services (MRSS) for children, youth and young adults. 988 call center will launch in July 2022, taking crisis calls at any time of day or night every day of the year.
