

IHN Region COVID 19 Case Count Data

- Oregon experienced 7 consecutive weeks of case counts declining before showing a slight increase last week. Oregon, as well as much of the United States, is at a concerning plateau. Case counts remain higher than earlier pandemic peaks with transmission still widespread. Europe's patterns of transmission have been leading indicators of what my happen in our country. Some parts of Europe have higher vaccination rates than the U.S. does; cases in Europe are increasing. That points to waning immunity and the need for booster doses of vaccine.
- Loss of life impacts from COVID 19: # of Global Deaths passed 5 Million the first week of November # of U.S. Deaths: 751,535 # of Oregon Deaths: 4,469
- A CDC Study released at the end of October showed that unvaccinated people who had previously recovered from a coronavirus infection were <u>five times as</u> <u>likely to get Covid</u> as people who had received both shots of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines.
- OHSU's most recent COVID Modeling Report is <u>here</u>. The report predicts that Oregon will reach "herd immunity" in mid-December with 85%-95% of the population either having been infected with COVID or having been immunized for COVID.

- Vaccination is now indicated and occurring for all of the following groups:
 - a) Initial doses for those adults not yet having received the vaccine
 - b) "3rd" doses for the immune-compromised.
 - c) Booster doses for all persons who received J and J Vaccine
 - d) Booster doses (if >6 months after initial series) for those 65 years and older, 50 years and older and older with chronic conditions or anyone who is in a high exposure risk job or environment.
 - e) Initial doses for ages 5-17 years.
